Howard talked about proposed changes to the Pittman Robinson Act that would cancel the 11% tax on firearms and ammunition. The Pittman-Robertson Wildlife Restoration Act was passed in 1937. The legislation took an existing excise tax on firearms and reallocated the proceeds to a grant fund for state wildlife agencies. It established a program of matching federal grants to the states for “wildlife restoration projects.”
